NSCC International Blogging Guidelines

Our Blog is now on our Website—www.international.nscC.ca

During your International Learning Program, it is mandatory that you post at least one blog entry to the NSCC International blog. This gives you an opportunity to reflect on your learning and cultural experience and express it to a wide audience. Your blog is posted on a public domain site and can be viewed by anyone including NSCC employees and students, future and/or current employers, family, friends and even those not familiar with NSCC and NSCC International programs. By agreeing to be a “Guest Blogger”, you will also agree to the following guidelines:

- 📡 Absolutely no use of profanity or offensive language of any kind;
- 📡 Keep the entry short, concise and relevant to your learning and cultural experiences (200 words maximum);
- 📡 All blogs posted must be signed by the individual with title/role at NSCC stated (e.g. John Smith, NSCC Student, Photography);
- 📡 All blogs must be sent to the NSCC staff or faculty lead before being posted to the site;
- 📡 NSCC staff or faculty leads cannot edit any content of a blog entry;
- 📡 To help you write your blog use the following guiding questions:
 - 1) What has been my most important learning moment during my international learning program?
 - 2) How is participating in this program going to make me more employable?
 - 3) What skills have I developed that will help with my personal and professional goals?

These guidelines have not been implemented as a form of censorship but to create a safe and un-intimidating environment for NSCC students and employees to express their experiences during an International Learning Program.
