Project Summary (2000 characters max.)	<p><b>Narrative description of Project:</b></p> <p>The purpose of the Appropriate Technical Training (ATT) project was to build the capacity of the National Union of Eritrean Youth and Students (NUEYS) to fulfill its mandate, as endorsed by the Eritrean Ministry of Education, to provide technical and vocational training that is responsive to the needs of employers in the Keren region. Through the ATT Project, NSCC and NUEYS partnered to develop and deliver training in metal working, wood working and entrepreneurship at the NUEYS Training Centre in Keren. In addition to strengthening of the existing learning programs in these two areas, an entrepreneurship curriculum was developed to introduce NUEYS instructors and trainees to basic self-employment concepts and principles.</p> <p>NUEYS increased its capacity to: (1) assess and meet community employment and training needs, (2) develop responsive and appropriate vocational training, (3) provide upgrading activities for training staff, and (4) incorporate an entrepreneurship component into the program.</p>
