



Education for Employment – Skills Development for Sustainable Fisheries MZ-12

PROJECT/INITIATIVE

The Education for Employment (EFE) program was funded by the Government of Canada and managed by Colleges and Institutes Canada. The purpose of the program was to build on the success of the Canadian College Partnership Program (CCPP). The focus of the EFE approach was to support a more rapid adjustment of skills training to the rapidly changing employment, social and economic realities. The purpose of the EFE was to create sustainable partnerships which contribute to the improvement and establishment of national policies to align training to employment needs, to the implementation of institutional services for the benefit of employers, their employees and the self-employed, and to increased employability of the general public

The MZ-12 project aimed to help improve living conditions of the local population through promotion of sustainable fisheries management. Nova Scotia Community College (NSCC) collaborated with Escola Secundaria Januario Pedro (ESJP) on capacity strengthening in fishing and fish processing and preservation (including innovative and sustainable technologies); market access and marketing; small business management and entrepreneurial skills; sustainable aquaculture; fishing gear maintenance and repair, safety at sea, small engine maintenance and repair; and vessel design.

SERVICES PROVIDED

In cooperation with the partner from Mozambique experts from NSCC, MI and CNBC were responsible for the planning and implementation of the following project activities:

- Occupational and labour market analysis
- Teacher training focused on CBET approach to teaching, curriculum development and lesson planning, and assessment and evaluation
- Leadership and management training
- IT and student registration training and capacity building
- Strengthening of the entrepreneurship curriculum
- Public outreach strategy developed with local industries and communities

RESULTS ACHIEVED

The project assisted the local partner to incorporate sustainable fisheries management practices into its programming and to produce graduates with improved employment and self-employment skills.
