



STUDENT BURSARIES

NSCC received funding from the Government of Canada to support student learning abroad. The Global Skills Opportunity (GSO) was launched in November 2021.

The program seeks to increase the number of Canadian students that participate in international study/work abroad experiences. The federal policy for the program offers additional funding to students that identify as:

Low-income students: students who report to be in receipt of Canada Student Grants, or similar non-repayable student financial assistance offered by provinces and territories, or in the absence of receiving non-repayable student financial assistance, can provide information to demonstrate that they require financial support to study or work abroad.

Indigenous students: students who report being an Indigenous person, that is, First Nations, Metis or Inuk (Inuit).

Students with disabilities: students who report to have a difficulty or impairment due to a long term condition or health problem and/or experience a limitation in their daily activities.

If you qualify as a student from one of these groups, you will be eligible to apply for a bursary of up to **\$3,500**. All other students qualify to apply for a bursary of up to **\$2,500**.

Students need to be 18+ years of age and a Canadian citizen to be eligible to receive this envelope of federal funding. Other bursaries will be available for those who are not eligible.

To qualify for the full bursary, students must fully complete the pre-departure online course, attend the mandatory pre-departure conference and travel meetings, post-participation feedback and evaluation and complete the GSO pre and post program surveys.
